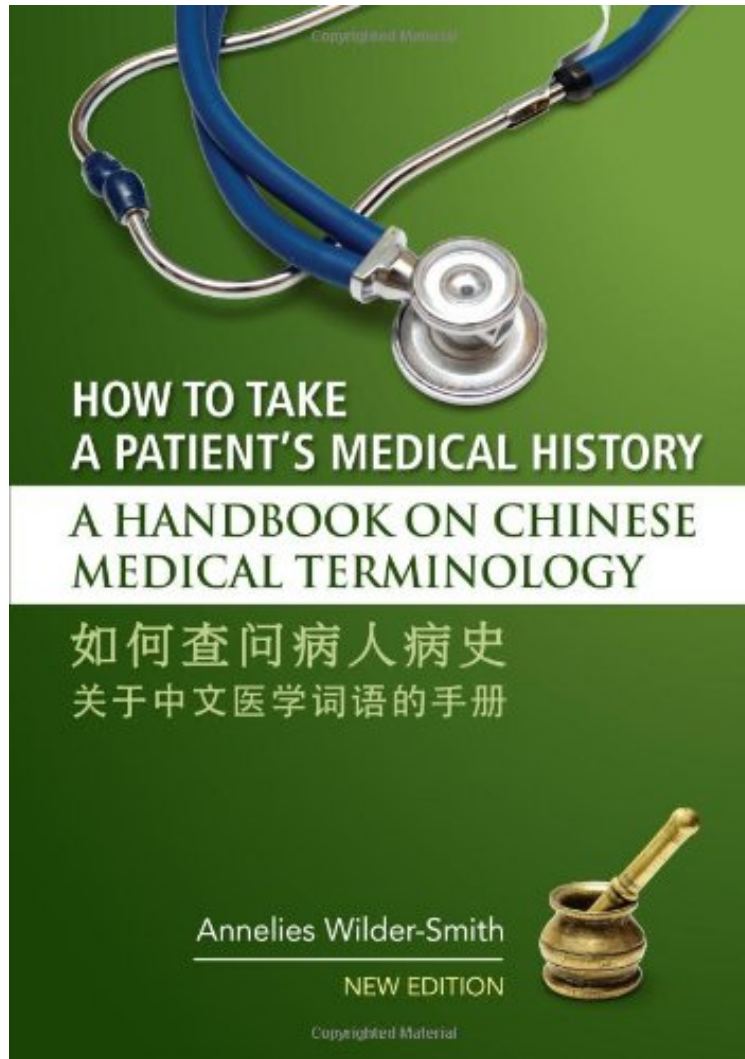

Remember that although Taiwan and China both speak Mandarin Chinese, the two countries have made completely different choices about how medical

terminology is translated (and Hong Kong has made yet different choices again). This book is for Mainland Chinese ONLY.
