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ICD-10-CM Snapshot 2017 Ophthalmology

Pulmonary Coding Tip
If a definitive diagnosis has not been established by the end of the encounter, it is acceptable to report sign(s) and/or symptom(s) in lieu of a definitive diagnosis. When sufficient clinical information is not known or available about a particular health condition to assign a more specific code, the appropriate "unspecified" code (eg, a diagnosis of pneumonia has been determined, but not the specific type). Unspecified codes should be reported when they are the codes that most accurately reflect what is known about the patient's condition at the time of that particular encounter.
The inclusion of the + (back) symbol indicates that an additional digit is needed. For example, **Cancer** Bronchus C34.0.

- exposure to environmental tobacco smoke (Z73.23)
- history of tobacco use (Z87.891)
- occupational exposure to environmental tobacco smoke (Z73.31)
- tobacco dependence-see Category F17
- tobacco use (Z72.0)
