

ICD-10 Snapshot 2016 Coding Cards Obstetrics/Gynecology

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Obstetrics/Gynecology Coding Tip

Use additional code from Category Z3A, weeks of gestation, to identify the specific week of the pregnancy.

Categories O32, O36, O64, O69 and Subcategory O33.5, require a 7th character. Assign 0 for single gestation and 1 (fetus 1), 2 (fetus 2), 3 (fetus 3), 4 (fetus 4), 5 (fetus 5), or 9 (other fetus) for multiple gestations. In addition, assign a code from Category O30 when the 7th character of 1-9 is used. (Applies to listings with * symbol)

The inclusion of the - [dash] symbol indicates that an additional digit is needed.
