During the course of my Immunohematology class the number of errors that were seen in this book keeps going up. We have emailed the publisher/ company/ writer, but have never gotten a response. My classmates used a total of three different texts for this class and the Quinley text disagreed with the other two and when verified with the internet sources Quinley was usually incorrect. Huge disagreements in antigen/ antibody characteristics. Other big Typos's.. An example is on P292 under unit selection for transfusion of infants after birth. The text refers to "Box 16-4" for the formula on how to calculate the reconstitution of a unit after centrifugation. Box 16-4 actually contains a list of clinical indications for administration of RHIG. The actual needed formula is not listed.
