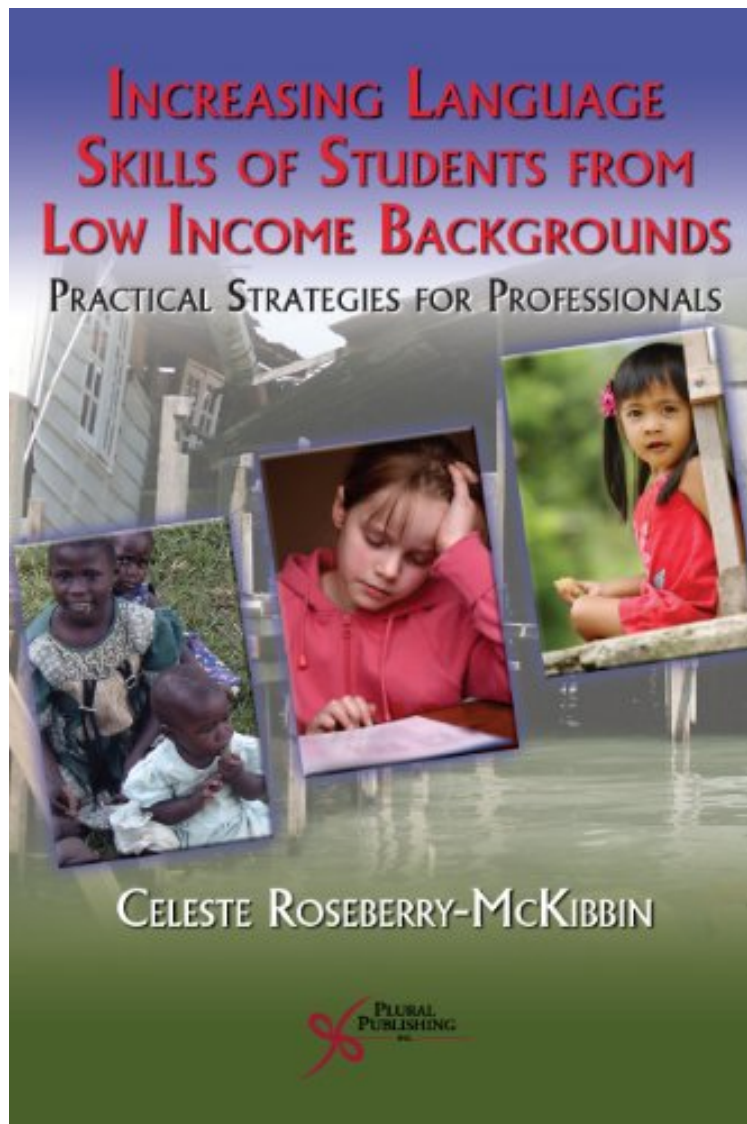


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Increasing Language Skills of Students from Low-Income Backgrounds: Practical Strategies for Professionals
