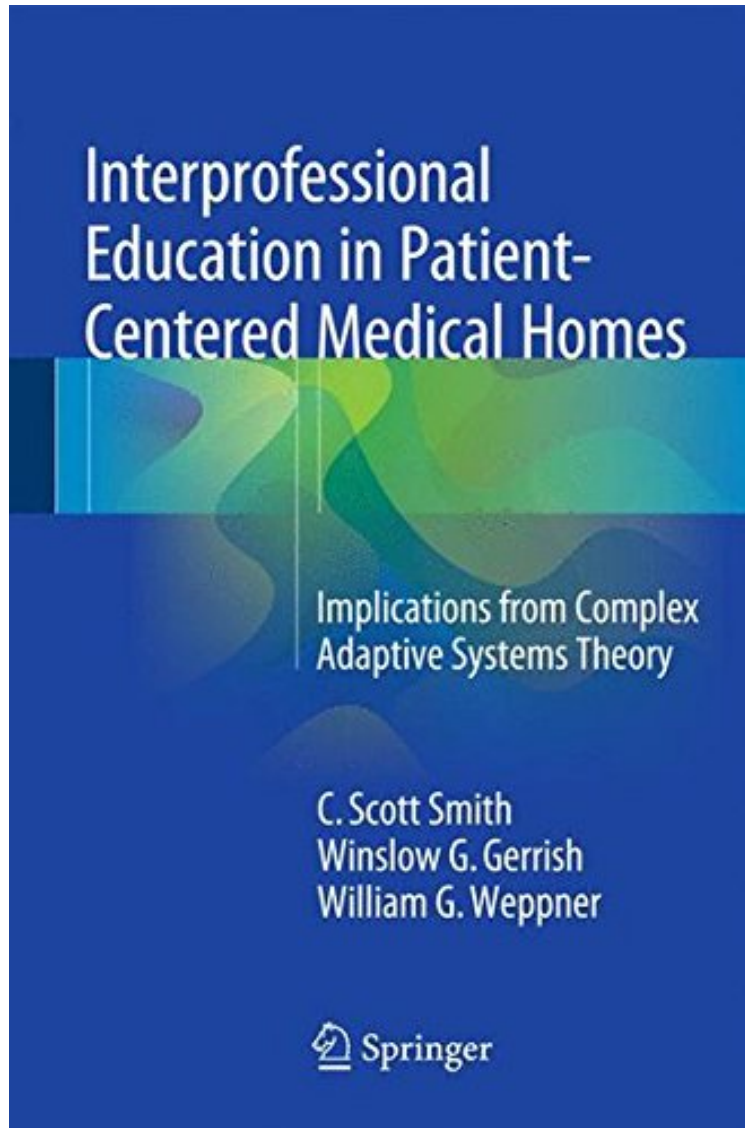


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Interprofessional Education in Patient-Centered Medical Homes: Implications from Complex Adaptive Systems Theory

It explains why some PCMH pilots are highly successful while others do not show much benefit, covers specific sub-theories that allow for bracketing of different aspects of the clinic system and highlights strategies by which institutions can engage in this process.
