I already have my degree in computer information systems, so my review maybe a little biased.First of all, I understand that it takes a year+ to go from rough draft to final product. The copyright date, for this edition, is 2011. The authors refer to computers with megahertz-speed processors. Please, try to find a megahertz processor at your local computer store.Second, the hard drive is referred to as the brain of the computer and then two paragraphs later, the processor is also referred to as the brain.Note to the authors: please have someone with a computer science background review your material for accuracy and timeliness.Third, the authors draw heavily on other author's work (they give credit), however, they make inaccurate assumptions with the information they reference.And lastly, while I understand the need to build a foundation-level of knowledge, the authors insist on repeating information discussed in previous paragraphs and chapters. Sometimes this information is stated 3 times in a single paragraph with just single word changes. Read: brevity. You could easily shave 25%-30% off each chapter.I don't blame the authors; I'm sure they are focused on other areas of their careers.
