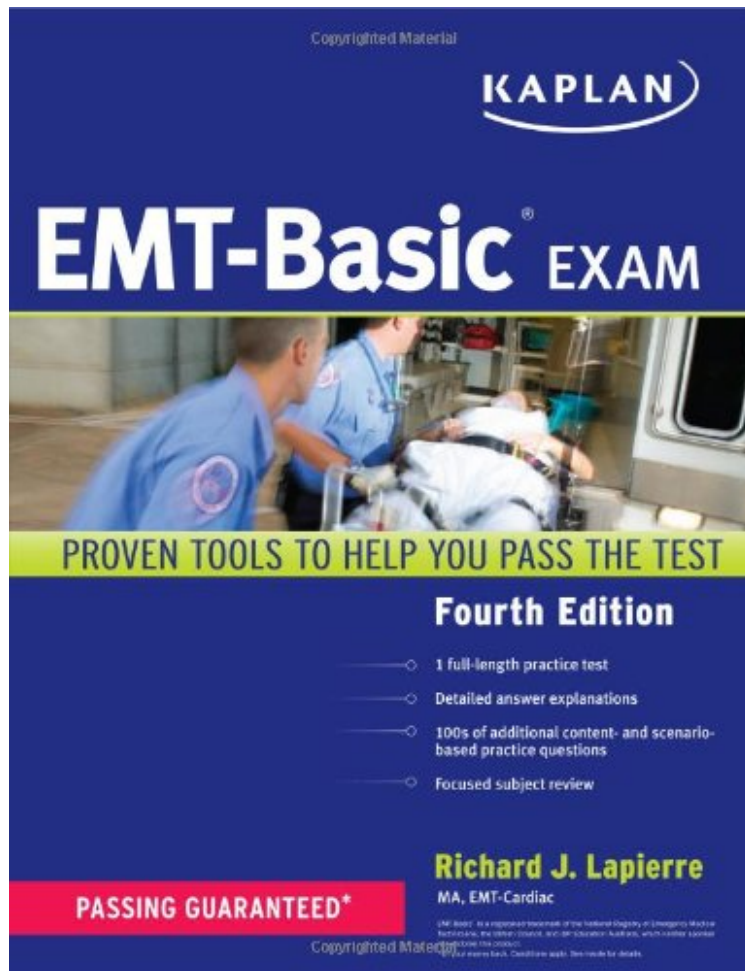

In all of the practice section tests, most of the questions were asking things that were not reviewed in that section. The final had typo which #118 was supposed to be "D" not "B".

Questions vary in strength and being honest, it was not even comparable to the actual NREMT.I passed the NREMT on the first try a couple days ago while studying for it three days prior. I would not recommend this book to anyone since if you're going to be putting a book specifically for the test, it should resemble and be harder than the national test. I would recommend one of those emt-training websites where you can take on as many questions as you want with multiple practice exams.I would have thought more highly of Kaplan since they made good MCAT books, but
