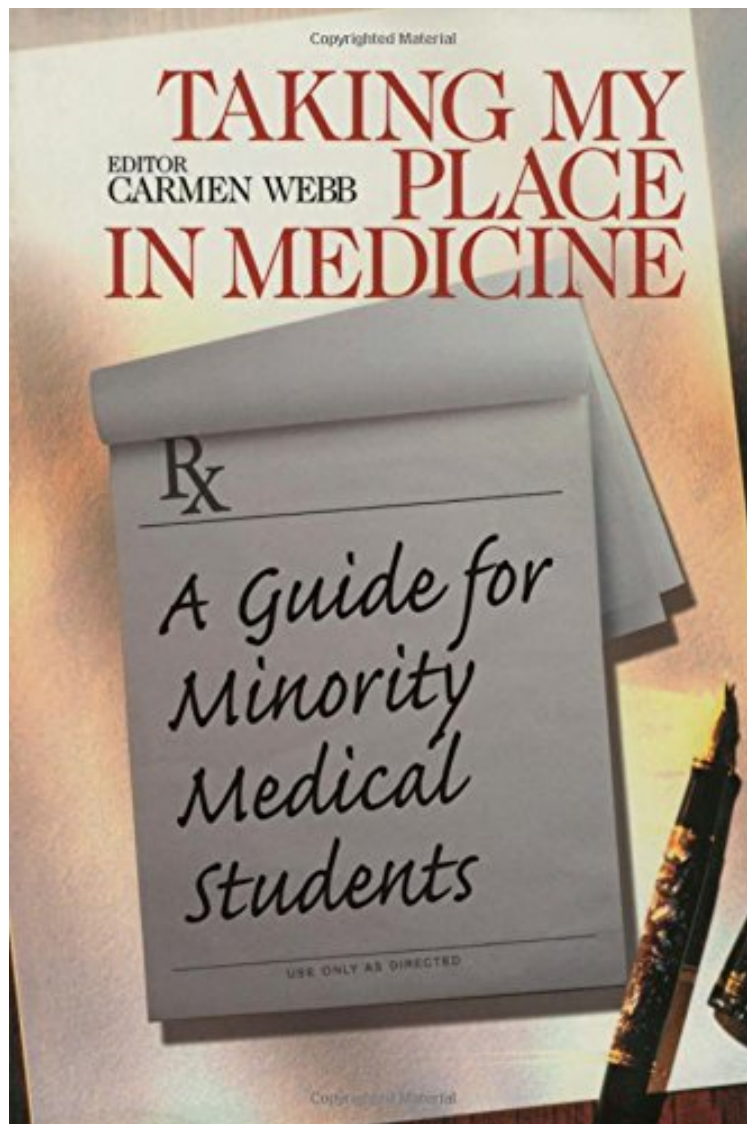

My only criticism of this text is that it doesn't contain a lot of concrete advice to minority medical students such as how to find scholarships and choose a medical school that is progressive on the issue of diversity.
